

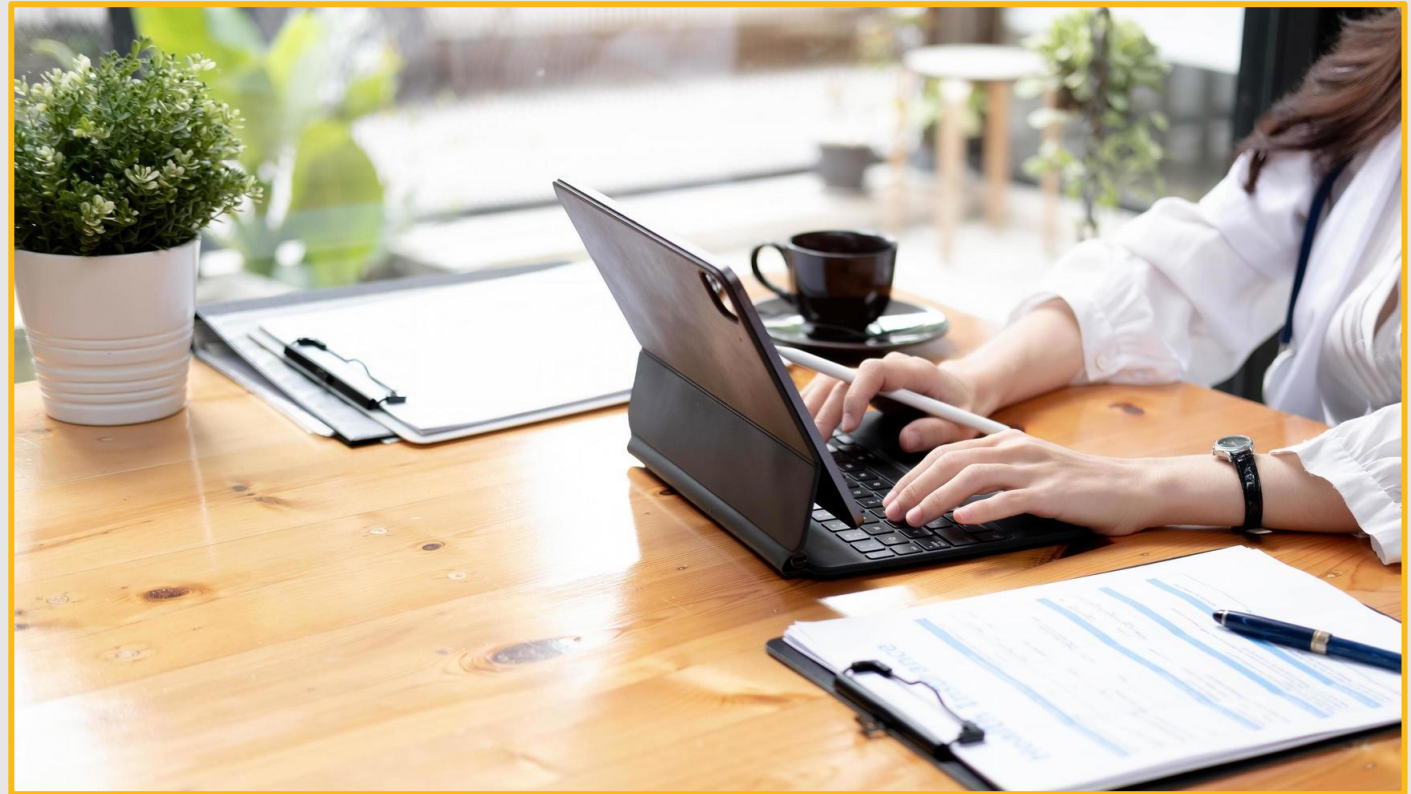

## Working with the Health Authority & Collaborating



I used past relationships with IH contacts to introduce the Community Connector role.

From there, the Quick Response Team became a huge advocate, and eventually I was invited to present at the hospital.

Now, I receive regular referrals from a wide range of IH staff, including doctors and nurses in the community.

## Additional Collaborations



### **Emergency Food Program** *Partnership with Turning Points:*

- Adopt a Senior Emergency Food Program
- Uses DoorDash with United Way for delivery

### **Supports:**

- Seniors identified with no food
- Hospital discharges with empty fridges
- Recovering clients with no energy to cook

## Additional Collaborations



### **Access to Emergency Shelter**

Turning Points also offers hotel rooms

Used for urgent shelter needs:

- After housefires
- Short-term needs between placements (access to healthcare)
- Lost housing during hospital stay

- Cooking classes for connection & skill-building
- Stained glass workshop led by a Social Prescribing participant
